Juneteenth Summit to Focus on Racial Disparities in Housing, Gentrification,
Affordable Housing Shortages, Evictions, and the Effect of COVID Pandemic
J. Wesley Daniels, Jr., CEO of East Baton Rouge Housing Authority, to Participate

East Baton Rouge Parish Housing Authority Chief Executive Officer, J. Wesley Daniels, Jr., is a part of a panel of affordable housing experts participating in an upcoming racial injustice in housing live-stream discussion on June 17th. Mr. Daniels is a recognized leader in the fight to eliminate housing inequities and create greater housing opportunities. His strategy leverages these housing opportunities to provide access to education, economic opportunities, and health & wellness for the region's families.

The event called "Unequal Burden: Exploring Racial Injustice in the Housing Market" is free and open to the public. It is sponsored by The Advocate, Times Picayune, Acadiana Advocate, and Gambit (all of which are owned by Georges Media Group). The moderator is Jessica Williams of The Advocate.
